International AHT Conference at Diocese of Durgapur

Diocese of Durgapur, CNI in Partnership with United Society Partners in the Gospel (USPG) hosted a Global Conference on Anti-Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery from 3rd to 8th November 2025 at Durgapur and Malda. Where global and Indian delegates were brought together from various parts of the world and state of West Bengal for one mission to combat the social evil practices of India particularly in deaferent regions of West Bengal. The Inauguration was graced by the esteemed presence of The Most Revd. Dr. Paritosh Canning, Moderator, CNI, The Rt. Revd. Silvans Christian, Deputy Moderator, Revd. Dr. D. J. Ajith Kumar, General Secretary; Mr. Subrata Gorai, Treasurer, and The Rt. Revd. Sameer Khimla, Bishop of Durgapur Diocese. Adv. Fernandas Raja, General Secretary, CSI and representatives from USPG - Revd. Canon Dr. Duncan Dormor, General Secretary, Revd. Canon Dr. Peniel Rajkumar, Director for Global Mission; and Revd. Davidson Solanki, Regional Secretary, the inauguration of the conference commenced with the feet washing ceremony by DWFCS followed by inaugural program at Odeum Hall, St. Michael's School, Durgapur.

On 3rd November, the conference commenced with an inaugural worship service. From 4th to 5th November sessions included sharing expectations, theological reflections, best practices from various regions, and presentations on concepts and legal frameworks. Participants engaged in group work, cultural exchanges, and action planning to combat modern slavery.

Overall, the event was a great success, strengthening global partnerships and expressing deep gratitude to USPG for their unwavering support. ■


Munna Pal Basuli, assistant teacher at Mission Girls School, Bankura, wins Umlingla Pass

Confirmation Service at Burnpur Christ Church
